August 15 Bridges Out of Poverty at Cedar Springs Presbyterian & December 3 at the Regas Building

Time: 9 am - 4:30pm - This workshop helps churches, community organizations, and businesses better understand what it is like to live in poverty and gives you tools to assist those in our community who are struggling.

August 27 - Frontline 1: Responding to Requests for Assistance 1-4 pm - Central Baptist Bearden - It happens to everyone, with more and more frequency, someone asks you, "Can you help me?" How do you respond to requests for assistance? Not sure? This workshop covers topics such as: how to help and not enable, how to verify circumstances, when 'No' is appropriate, and the top 10 best practices. **Free for Members/\$50 each for Non-Members**

September 17 - Frontline 2: New Strategies for a Strong Benevolence Team 1-4 pm - Cokesbury UMC - This three-hour workshop walks benevolence staff and volunteers through the process of building a team at their church to handle benevolence requests. Free for Members/\$50 each for Non-Members

September 24 - Frontline 3: Understanding Community Resources 1-3 pm - Location TBD - This workshop provides connections to resources and how to make referrals. Each quarterly workshop focuses on a different point of pain in our city. Social service agencies speak and offer pamphlets on community resources. Free for Members/\$15 each for Non-Members

October 5 - Cost of Poverty Experience (COPE) Sign-in 8:30 am/simulation begins at 9 am - 12 pm at Messiah Lutheran Church - This is an empathy building, bias breaking poverty simulation that in just 3 hours allows you to live a month in the life of a low-income family. \$25 each for Members/\$50 each for Non-Members

October 31 - Frontline 4: Mentoring and Relationship Building Time 1-4 pm - Cokesbury UMC

This workshop contains tried and true best practices, tips and practical applications to further equip you to 'go deep' in relationships with those you serve, navigating the typical relational challenges and avoiding pitfalls.

Just some of the ways your sponsorship helps us help others:

- *Connection Point* is a Knox County call center for individuals and families in need. Requests are reviewed and verified by Compassion Coalition volunteers from area churches who then make referrals to appropriate organizations, agencies, and churches in our community that may be able to assist. Connection Point is also a resource for churches and organizations working with individuals in need.
- *Faith & Finances* is a 12-session class for low-income or financially vulnerable adults. Each 90-minute session is designed to help those who struggle to manage their money and overcome real-world pitfalls on the path to financial health.
- *Getting Ahead in a Just-Gettin'-By World* is a 16 session class that offers a step-by-step process for low-income people to investigate their lives on their own terms and, discover why they are in their situation, develop a plan to get themselves to a more stable life, and begin to build relationships that will help ensure sustainability as they go.
